Accelerated Literacy and the Premier's Reading Challenge




During 2018 the numerous and varied titles studied in each classroom were added to the list of 12 items read to achieve this year's Premier's Reading Challenge.

We explored what a tower is and the children had different opportunities to build their own towers.


