# Wellbeing Coordinator

This term at Fraser Park we are running a small group dance program with some students from Wa:nyl. Every Monday afternoon the group will be learning a choreographed hip hop dance which they will be performing at the end of year concert. This is supporting the work we do in Oral Language and building vocabulary. Dance is fun way that students can develop Oral Language and helps to build Tier 2 words that are specific to dance. It also helps to build students skills in listening and responding as students are learning new skills. Students have identified dance as an activity that they believe is helping their learning.

We have also been working with Sam Oshodi to learn African Drumming. There is a significant amount of research that shows that drumming builds Oral Language and is important for building rhythm and developing the brain and strengthening the connection between the left and right side of the brain. The students have been enjoying drumming and have learned new songs and rhythms.


FIND YOUR TREASURE

This fortnight in Pulyeri the children started reading the story *Mr Kwok's Kites* by Elaine Lindsay. They were very good at identifying the front and back cover, and the title when we read the story. Some of the learning experiences the children were involved in relation to this story have been making rainbow paper plate kites, painting material and then using this for kites, listening and saying the



letter names and sounds of K, L, C, & P. part of this included the alliterations used in the story: leopard leaping, crocodile crawling and peacock preening. The children have started expanding their vocabulary as they have



learnt about the words preening, scales, and peacocks.



For the Child Protection Curriculum so far this term the children have been filling buckets by being caring and learning about the warning signs our bodies use to tell us something is not right.



Other learning experiences the children have enjoyed have been obstacle courses, painting, making



creations with boxes, riding bikes, cooking in the mud pit, reading with Mrs Hein, and drumming with Sam.
