PULYERI NEWS



This term we are looking at the story *Farmer Duck* by Martin Waddell. Learning experiences related to this story include listening to the story, acting it out, using puppets, toys and felt boards to retell the story, making farm animal crafts, having provocations from farms to inspire play and story writing, looking at concepts such as sharing and working together, and gardening.



The vocabulary that we are focussing on in relation to this story are the words and terms: *Fetch, Fed up, Weep, Creep, Creak, Fled and Weary*. These terms will be explored through play and small group experiences.



Other learning experiences this term will include, reading books, book making, name writing, creative play, working on identity webs, learning about the importance of telling the truth through the stories *Thukeri* and *The Boy Who Cried Wolf*, exploring nature through nature play and contributing ideas and learning to the *Pulyeri Floor Book*. Some ideas have already included making a car track, making and going on treasure hunts, and making clay animals.
